

## Project on International Peace & Security Military Fellowship Program

The Project on International Peace and Security (PIPS) is an undergraduate think tank designed to bridge the gap between the academic and foreign policy communities in the area of undergraduate education. We are seeking military personnel interested in supporting their Research Fellowship Program. Selected military fellows will serve for one academic year and mentor undergraduate fellows to conduct policy-relevant work in the area of international security. Previous fellowship information can be found here. Location in the Williamsburg, VA area is not required. However, applicants living in the greater Norfolk-Washington, DC area are preferred to allow for in-person interaction with students a few times during the year.

## **Responsibilities:**

- Mentor one or more undergraduate fellows throughout the academic year 2017- 2018
- Support the development of policy projects, provide content and editorial support on policy proposals, and assist with the publication of the resultant white paper – initially will take place on the W&M Jefferson Forum (a school-created private Facebook Group)
- Possible in-person visits w/ undergraduate fellows at William & Mary or in the Norfolk/DC area; with tentative Group-wide visits in mid-November 2017 and March 2018

The estimated workload for a military fellow includes:

Fall Semester: 1 hour per week
Spring Semester: 1-2 hours per week

## **Required Application Packet** (please provide all documents in PDF format):

- Resume detailing professional and educational experience
- Essay describing a major foreign policy issue for the U.S. and possible approaches/solutions (no more than 1500 words) can be a previously written/published piece
